Rejected projects:

*Extra benches/seating, Walthamstow Town Centre* – it will go against Council's policy on street furniture.

*Re-opening of St James's Library feasibility study* – The resident's suggestion submitted to the Community Council in June made no mention of a specific building. Officers therefore investigated the rationale for a feasibility study exploring the availability of community venues in the area.

At their meeting on 30th September, Cabinet rejected the recommendation of the Scrutiny Committee and will not be reviewing the decision to close St James' St Library.
